Join the fun at a Cookie Rally or Kick-Off and lend a hand! Whether you're running a station or leading a game, your energy helps the cookie season start with a BANG!

Cookie Rookie Troop Meeting Guide

Hey Cookie Captains and adult volunteers! You've got the power to make learning about cookies fun and memorable. Use these games to plan your troop meeting – or mix things up with ideas from Little Brownie Bakers.



☑ Great to Meet You!

Introduce yourself and share your Girl Scout story! Try these convo starters:

- Ever eaten a Girl Scout Cookie? (Yum!)
- Ever seen Girl Scouts selling cookies?
- Does selling cookies sound like fun?

Tell them how the cookie program works - and how it's *way* more than just selling snacks. It's about goals, confidence and teamwork!

☑ Know Your Cookies

Let's learn what we're selling! Play a fun game like Cookie Concentration!

& Cookie Concentration:

Make matching cards with cookie pictures. Girls take turns flipping two at a time to find matches. Got samples? Let them taste-test their winning match!

☑ Pitch Perfect

It's time to practice cookie marketing! Show how *you* talk to customers, then let the girls try. Use this fun roleplay game:

@ Pitch Game:

Toss a ball around the circle. When a girl catches it, she gives her best cookie pitch. Then she tosses it to the next Girl Scout. Keep going until everyone's practiced!

☑ Money, Money!

Learning about money is part of being a Cookie Boss! Teach the cost of a box of cookies, how to count change and how much goes to the troop.

Play Store Game:

Set up a pretend store using toys or pictures and play money. Let girls take turns being the buyer and seller!

✓ Marketing Magic

Let's get creative! Eye-catching signs and clever cookie costumes help boost sales!

Page 19 Booth Crafting:

Make posters, QR flyers, banners or even sandwich boards. Want to go big? Make a cookie costume!

✓ Set Those Goals

Cookies help us do amazing things. Let girls dream big and set their troop goals!

Draw Your Dream:

What will the troop do with their cookie earnings? Camp? A big trip? Supplies? Let the girls draw their dream, then figure out how many boxes they'll need to sell to make it happen!
