| Appointed by: | USAGSO Highest Awards Coordinator |
| Term of Appointment: | One year, October 1st through September 31st, renewable annually at the agreement of the Highest Awards Coordinator and the individual member. |
| Accountability: | To support and guide Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts in the pursuit of the Gold Award. To uphold the standards of the Girl Scout Gold Award. |

Qualifications and Core Competencies:

- * Present a positive image of Girl Scouting to girls, volunteers and community members
- * Strategic thinker with an open mind and positive, forward-thinking attitude
- * Ability to work with diverse people from different countries, backgrounds, professions and experiences for the benefit of the council as a whole
- * Values volunteerism
- * Honest and clear communication style
- * Ability to communicate with youth and provide constructive feedback
- * Collaboration skills
- * Commitment to advancing the Girl Scout mission

Expectations:

- * Accept the principles, beliefs, and mission of Girl Scouting, and its statement of values found in the Girl Scout Promise and Law
- * Register as a member of Girl Scouts of the USA annually (or as a lifetime member)
- * Complete at least one (1) Gold Award training
- * Keep up to date with the changing needs of girls and Gold Award requirements
- * Read the Gold Award Girl and Adult Guidebooks
- * Review Girl Scout Gold Award project proposals and final reports prior to committee meetings
- * Prepare feedback and approval for proposals and final reports
- * When necessary, work individually with Girl Scouts pursuing their Gold Award and their project advisors to incorporate committee feedback into project proposals and final reports
- * Participate in at least 75% of USAGSO Gold Award Committee meetings and send feedback if unable to attend meetings.
